

Introduction

During the first year of the establishment phase of <u>E-RIHS NL</u>, four projects were selected from the offerings of the parties actively involved in the development of E-RIHS from the outset. The Ministry of Education, Culture, and Science subsidized these projects to strengthen the Dutch infrastructure in preparation for E-RIHS.NL. One of these projects is the improvement of <u>IsoArcH</u>. One of the desired enhancements of the database is to allow users within IsoArcH to create a personal space to work with the data in a secure environment, for example, during a research project. Within this space, users can customize their own digital maps and export them for personal use. After a quality check by administrators and potential (peer-reviewed) publication, this data can then be added to the general database and made accessible to everyone.

Aim of the workshop

In the past year, <u>Witteveen + Bos</u>, along with Kévin and Xavier, have made significant progress. This workshop aims to provide an overview of the progress IsoArcH has made in the recent period and what still needs to be done to conclude the E-RIHS project. User input is crucial for this purpose. What is working well, what needs to change, and what are the users' preferences? The workshop will also consider the future of IsoArcH; the sustainability of the database is vital, but how can we best approach it?
